Vocational Rehabilitation in RAF Claims — A Critical Driver of Fair Compensation

Serious injuries often disrupt a claimant's capacity to engage in their pre-accident work. While physical impairment can be measured clinically, the real-world impact on a person's ability to earn a living demands careful, individualized vocational assessment.

Key Components of Vocational Rehabilitation Assessment:

- Comprehensive Functional Evaluation: Establishes physical, cognitive, and psychological capacity.
- Job Demand Analysis: Compares claimant capabilities against essential duties of previous and potential employment.
- Labor Market Survey: Identifies realistic employment alternatives within the current South African economy.
- Transferable Skills Analysis: Highlights other occupational options based on education, experience, and functional ability.
- Vocational Prognosis: Forecasts short-term and long-term employability considering the nature of injuries.
